# Psychology of Dynamic Learning Environments and Learning Experiences

## Design That Activates The Brain And Body

Dynamic learning environments stimulate brain activity and motivation by aligning physical space with how students naturally learn best. According to principles from neuroarchitecture, three key psychological drivers—autonomy, movement, and stimulation—are at the core of effective educational design.

### Autonomy

Students are more engaged when they have control over where and how they learn.

- Flexible seating options (e.g., stools, booths, high tops)
- Zones for independent work or quiet reflection
- Mobile furniture that empowers students to adapt the space



### Movement

Physical activity enhances focus, memory, and emotional regulation—design that encourages movement helps activate both brain and body.

- Outdoor spaces that promote walking, stretching, and free movement
- Seating arrangements that support posture shifts and dynamic learning
- Flexible layouts for kinesthetic lessons and active breaks



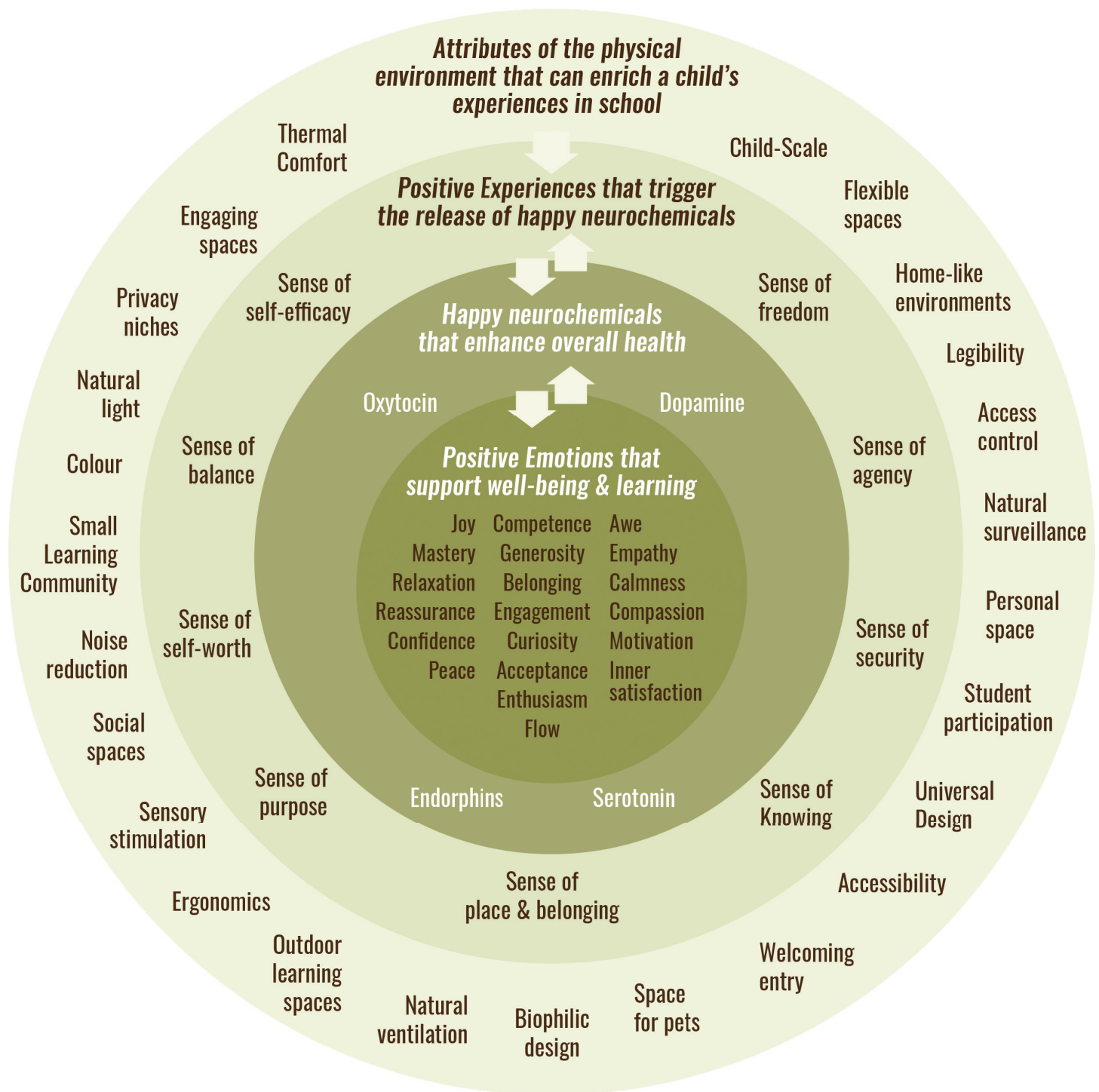
### Stimulation

Vibrant, sensory-rich spaces keep students alert, curious, and emotionally connected.

- Color theory that promotes focus or calm (e.g., blues for reading, oranges for creativity)
- Lighting variation and natural daylight
- Graphics, textures, and movement that spark curiosity

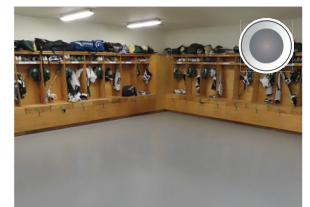

# Furniture Standards

## Classrooms



During our evaluation of classroom environments, AmTab identified a consistent trend: most instructional spaces are equipped with desks and chairs that are 10–15 years old. These legacy furnishings lack ergonomic design, inhibit flexible learning configurations, and contribute to student disengagement.

**Recommendation:** Transition to AmTab ErgoEngage® Chairs—specifically engineered to support varied teaching methods and student needs. With ergonomic back support, lightweight mobility, and flexible configurations, ErgoEngage® enables educators to create dynamic, student-centered classrooms aligned to the district’s standards.

## Dining Commons and Food Courts



Our evaluation of dining spaces revealed that several cafeterias lack adequate seating capacity, leading to overcrowding, reduced comfort, and shortened meal times. Much of the existing furniture is outdated—often heavy, immobile, and difficult to sanitize.

**Recommendation:** Upgrade to a variety of AmTab high-performance, space-efficient, and easy-to-clean seating solutions designed for dynamic K-12 dining environments. ## Media Centers and Libraries

Library and media center spaces across the district exhibited a recurring issue: most environments are outfitted with rigid, outdated furniture that lack flexibility and variety. Current layouts do not adequately support diverse learning needs.

**Recommendation:** Transform libraries into vibrant, student-centered learning hubs with a mix of AmTab Soft Seating, Collaborative Tables, and Ergonomic Seating. These flexible, mobile solutions support a range of learning styles—quiet zones for individual focus, open layouts for group collaboration, or tech-ready spaces for digital engagement.



## Learning Commons and Flex Spaces

The current Learning Commons and Flex Spaces present a strong foundation with potential for transformation. While the existing layout provides basic functionality, the furniture is static and traditional, unable to support diverse ways students learn today.

**Recommendation:** Upgrade to a versatile mix of AmTab Mobile Conversation Tables, Soft Seating, Collaborative Tables, Booths and Settees. These modular, mobile solutions are purposefully designed to allow multiple learning styles: group work, independent study, presentations, and collaboration. # Signage Graphics Decor Standards

School signage graphics and decor within a district influence student branding, community pride, safety, and navigation. Implementing a signage system creates a welcoming environment, improves efficiency, and enhances school identity.



## Branding and School Identity

Schools that lack cohesive branding often struggle to establish a strong sense of school pride and recognition. Without clear signage, logos, or visual markers, students and visitors may find it harder to feel connected to the school community. A strong visual identity not only builds school spirit but also reinforces a shared culture and sense of belonging across campus.

## School Spirit and Motivational Decor

## Signage, Murals and Educational Graphics

Schools that incorporate large-scale educational murals report higher student engagement creativity, and ownership of space. These visuals bring learning to life and turn blank walls into opportunities for inspiration, storytelling, and exploration.

**Recommendation:** Install interactive wall graphics, subject-specific murals, and rotating student artwork in hallways and shared spaces to foster engagement and create an inspiring visual journey throughout the school.

## Colors and Aesthetics' Impact on Learning

The intentional use of color within educational spaces has been shown to directly influence student mood, focus, and performance. Cool tones like blue and green promote calmness and concentration, while warm hues like orange and yellow stimulate energy and creativity. Many schools today still feature outdated color palettes that do not support these outcomes.

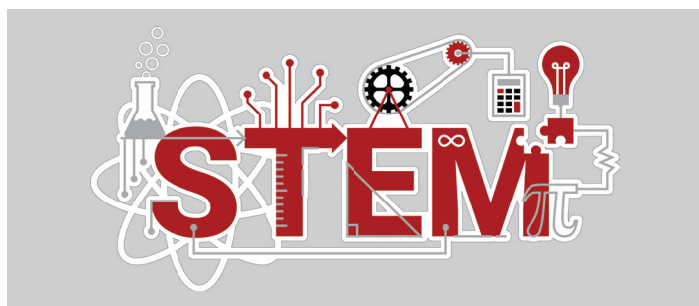
**Recommendation:** Refresh classrooms, dining spaces, and study areas using thoughtful color psychology that align with the intended use of each space—creating a more supportive, engaging, and student-centered environment.



## Readability and Visibility

Outdated or poorly placed signage can lead to confusion, frustration, and missed opportunities for communication. When fonts are too small, colors lack contrast, or placement is not strategic, signage becomes ineffective and underutilized. Improving visibility helps students, staff, and visitors navigate the campus more efficiently and confidently.

**Recommendation:** Upgrade to large-format, high-contrast signage placed in high-traffic and decision-point areas like corridors, entrances, and transitions. Prioritize clarity and accessibility to ensure messages are easily understood by all users, including young learners and visitors.

## School A - Classroom Discovery

- Classrooms desks and chairs are outdated, leading to poor ergonomics, reduced comfort, and limited mobility. A lack of flexible seating options hinders collaboration and active learning models.

**Recommendation:** Introduce ErgoEngage® Chair Series and Mobile Bench Tables. Modern, stackable, and easily cleanable furniture that optimizes space and supports high-traffic environments.

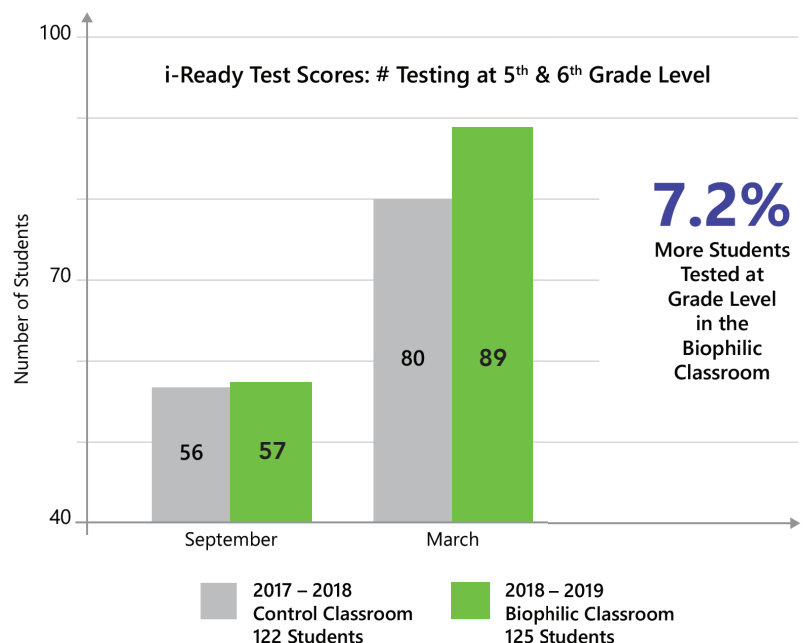
